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INTRODUCTION

Selected Topics in Science and Research at the Faculty of Humanities, Tomas Bata University in Zlín is a document with two objectives. First of all, to present the core topics in science in the research which we focus on at our faculty in a clear and concise form, and secondly to offer an incentive for potential parties who would like to collaborate in science and research at a regional, national and international level both within and outside of academia in terms of institutions and / or individuals.

The Faculty of Humanities (FHS) is a division of Tomas Bata University in Zlín (TBU) and a joint bearer of Baťa's international legacy. We consider the faculty's science and research activities, a selected part of which is presented below, to be fundamental at a regional level, relevant at a national level and not insignificant at an international level in terms of contribution to knowledge and social relevance. Our previous successes have undoubtedly been aided by the broad spectrum of activities we undertake in Cooperation with our partners, something we want to build on, deepen and expand. In this document we seek not only to increase the visibility and science and research relevance of our faculty and its partners, but also to communicate the significance of our newly acquired knowledge in terms of how it is practically utilized outside of the university context.

So here we present some of our core science and research topics, the individuals who are exploring them, as well as a list of projects and selected publications. In doing so we seek to secure and increase all areas of Cooperation in science and research (SaR), and we hope that some of the projects and the core ideas behind them will interest you as opportunities for potential collaboration or as incentives for academic discussion. At the end of this document, we also provide contact details for those interested in Cooperation with us in accordance with the topics presented here as well as other related topics for those seeking potential research partners.


PORTFOLIO OF FHS SCIENTIFIC FIELDS AND WORKPLACES

From a nationwide perspective, FHS is a unique institution in terms of the co-existence and cooperation among three research fields. The code list for the groups of fields in accordance with the Frascati Manual classifies these as follows:

- 3. Medical and Health Sciences: 3.3 Health Sciences
- 5. Social Sciences: 5.3 Education
- 6. Humanities and the Arts: 6.2 Languages and Literature

The structure of the faculty's workplaces reflects its specialisations. The **FHS Research Centre** not only brings together research interests at the faculty level, but also plays a significant role in the nationwide networking of experts in research. Another primary goal of the Research Centre concerns its activities fostering the popularisation of science, the education of academic staff as well as quality management.

The four departments of FHS TBU are engaged in educational and practical activities within the scientific fields listed above. Personnel at the **Department of Pedagogical Sciences** and **Department of School Education** focus on the development of social and school-related aspects of education. The **Department of Health Care Sciences** covers areas related to non-medical fields of healthcare. The **Department of Modern Languages and Literature** concentrates on English and German philology. In addition to these four departments, the **Language Centre** specifically focuses on teaching activities in terms of language training for students and academics, with its staff members also broadly involved in translating specialist texts at a university-wide level. The **Educational Support Centre** develops and organizes projects as well as networking in education.



SCIENCE AND RESEARCH COOPERATION AT THE FACULTY

At an **academic level**, institutions and individuals at FHS cooperate with a large number of specialist organizations (e.g. Asociace vzdělavatelů v sociální pedagogice / the Association of Educators in Social Pedagogy, headed by the director of our Department of Pedagogical Sciences, doc. Jakub Hladík, Asociace vysokoškolských vzdělavatelů nelékařských zdravotnických profesí v České Republice / the Association of Higher Education Educators in Non-Medical Healthcare Professions in the Czech Republic, Česká asociace pedagogického výzkumu / the Czech Educational Research Association) through activities such as organising international conferences. Academic faculty staff members are involved in the production of texts for many international academic journals, with which they also regularly collaborate by reviewing academic papers. The faculty publishes the peer-reviewed journal Sociální pedagogika (Social Education), more details here. Cooperation in science and research at the faculty is developed both through lectures by FHS academics at universities abroad as well as through public lectures and workshops by Czech and international scientists held at TBU.

An important common feature of our research activites is a close **connection to practice**, which involves cooperating with a wide range of organisations (in particular schools, social services institutions, companies and medical facilities), during which there is an active transfer of knowledge and experience between the academic and practical spheres, for example through so-called action research. A valuable outcome of this interlinking of research and practice is that our graduates have the lowest unemployment rate among TBU graduates along with the highest starting salaries. The users of the results we achieve include strategic partners, a list of which is available here. We carefully select the organisations which cooperate with us on the basis of references and previous experience. Cooperation is secured by contract, with arrangements set up in order to bring mutual benefits, with all activities based on the philosophy of research-based principles and practice.

DOCTORAL STUDY PROGRAM

The doctoral study program at FHS intensively develops research areas within two pedagogical lines, with the first devoted to topics in the field of school pedagogy, particularly preschool and primary education, and the second dedicated to social pedagogy.

Students are guided toward collaboration on research topics established at the faculty. The doctoral researchers must go through demanding exams, learn how to establish themselves in the professional community, participate in international conferences, as well as develop their professional communication skills in English. The degree candidates must also regularly present their progress in research at annual doctoral seminars. They also develop their communications skills by writing professional studies as well as learn strategies to incorporate feedback and criticism into their work.

An important part of the doctoral school at FHS is working with supervisors who assist their doctoral students in developing a solid professional background. The faculty supports doctoral students in their integration into research projects as well as also creates opportunities for international exchanges that strengthen the acquisition of the research experience of future academics. Doctoral studies are coordinated by the Doctoral Programme Board comprised of experts from the Czech Republic.

SELECTED TBU OPERATIONAL PROGRAMMES SUPPORTING SCIENCE AND RESEARCH

In supporting science and research, we pursue the continuous development of our internal science and research capabilities, primarily with the use of operational programmes jointly funded by the European Union. TBU activities undertaken through operational programmes strongly impact science and research at a university-wide level. FHS staff have the opportunity through these programmes to work continuously and systematically to develop an environment supporting science and research with a focus on the quality of the outcomes of creative activities and internationalisation.

The **Strategic Project of TBU in Zlín** focuses on systematic quality enhancement of educating activities and approaches to education at TBU, and also on improving process management and the assessment methods of all TBU activities. Implementation of this project will lead to the creation of the conditions to achieve TBU's strategic objectives, with the principle one remaining a systematic increase in the quality and efficacy of educational activities and approaches at TBU.

One of the sub-activities within the project entails the participation of the FHS Research Centre staff in educational workshops focused on social science and humanities research methodologies. The field of quantitatively-focused methodology and data analysis is overseen by Dr Ilona Kočvarová, while the field of qualitatively-focused methodology and data analysis is supervised by Dr Tomáš Karger. These activities also involve the networking of experts in terms of academic discussion and consultation in order to ensure the implementation of the latest international knowledge and trends in science and research methodology at the faculty.

In order to boost TBU internationalisation within the project, we secure a broad range of academic and scientific staff mobility options (internal and external). We are prepared to take part in funding activities leading to the establishment of science and research collaboration at a regional, national and international level.

The project **Institutional Quality and Development of Science Strategies at TBU** is focused on developing a system of strategic and managerial governance and organization of TBU research. This process incorporates human resources management, science and research evaluation, internationalisation, technology transfer, as well as open access and other ways of popularising science and research results. The project will incorporate elements of all basic systems of developing science strategy and evaluation:

- implementation and development of human resource management and establishing gender equality as well as long-term sustainability within scientific fields
- implementation of SaR evaluation of the implementation of 17+ Methodology and evaluating SaR at the level of research teams, departments and components of TBU in Zlín
- creation of a strategy and support measures for SaR internationalisation
- implementation of a technology transfer strategy
- creation and implementation of an open access institutional policy
- creation and implementation of a strategy for popularising SaR results achieved at TBU in Zlín

SELECTED RESEARCH TOPICS AND CONTACT DETAILS FOR THEIR INVESTIGATORS

The research topics included in this document are based on nominations from faculty academic and scientific staff which were collected, evaluated and selected for shortlisting by workplace heads in the 2020/21 academic year. The topics are divided into three categories in accordance with their main field (Pedagogy, English and German Philology, Non-Medical Healthcare Fields). A number of the topics are interdisciplinary in nature.

PEDAGOGY

ACTORS, DISCOURSES AND DETERMINANTS OF NON-FORMAL ADULT EDUCATION

Summary: This research topic broadly reflects the issue of non-formal adult education, focusing on its development and society-wide context, determinants of participation and non-participation in this education segment, changing barriers and motivations to learn, gender differences, etc. Our intention is to study this issue within an international context, as evidenced by the focus of our recently published papers and their publishing platforms.

SELF-REGULATED LEARNING AND BEHAVIOUR DEPENDING ON ENVIRONMENT

Summary: This research topic reflects the connection between personality, behaviour and environment in teaching, focusing on the internal (private) and shared (public, shared) world. It takes into account not only cognitive and non-cognitive aspects of self-regulation, but also the importance of the social and cultural environment, including the online environment. On the basis of a combination of findings and the latest trends in the concept of self-regulation (the Self-Regulation Model – SRM) the investigations attempt to capture the mechanisms of self-regulated learning and behaviour among pupils and students inside and outside the school environment, in the online and offline space. The research topic can be understood in both a local and international context.

INCLUSION IN THE EDUCATION OF GIFTED PUPILS

Summary: Within a broader definition of inclusion, this research investigates the education of gifted pupils and the determinants thereof. Analyses include work on barriers within institutions of inclusive education of gifted pupils as well as the position of teachers regarding the education of gifted pupils in an inclusive school. The problem of labelling gifted pupils within their education is also investigated. Qualitative and quantitative research strategies are incorporated in this work.

In line with the social model of disability, our attention is focused on studying people whose disadvantaged position as a result of age, health or adverse living circumstances hampers the fulfilment of their social, educational and other needs on an equal basis with others, and who thus require a greater level of support from the social system.

PROFESSIONALISATION OF TEACHERS AT PRE-PRIMARY AND PRIMARY SCHOOL LEVEL

Summary: This research is focused on monitoring the professionalisation of preservice preschool and primary school teachers from the beginning of their university programmes. The decision to study teaching is the product of one's previous individual experiences, interpersonal interactions and acts within a specific social and cultural environment and is based on an individually constructed *concept of being a teacher*. There is no predetermined innate concept of being a teacher, i.e. it is shaped over time by those both within and the profession. It is constructed on the one hand by social processes (within interpersonal interactions and by observing social models and roles), and on the other hand it is a personal process (internal interpretation of lived experiences and meanings).

SELF-EFFICACY OF PRESCHOOL AND PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS

Summary: This research project investigates the self-efficacy of preschool and primary school preservice and in-service teachers. Teachers who are confident in terms of their professional competence usually produce good instructional results, and therefore are not as prone to burnout or leaving the profession. This investigation of teacher self-efficacy is based on international methodological procedures, thus enabling comparisons of methodologies and results. The research goal is to assess, analyse and interpret teacher self-efficacy in the international context.

SPIRITUAL LITERACY FOCUSED ON PRE-PRIMARY AND PRIMARY EDUCATION

Summary: Research into the development of non-religious spirituality among children has been commonly discussed abroad in terms of the spiritual dimension in relation to the self (mindfulness, self-reflection, sense), to others (love, justice, pro-social disposition), to nature (environmental sensitivity), and to transcendence (wonder and awe, overlap, connections). Within the Czech context this is a relatively new research topic recently implemented mainly in non-formal education and in relation to spiritual health. This investigation is particularly focused on the previously neglected areas of pre-primary and primary education.

SOCIAL AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY IN EDUCATION

Summary: Social and cultural conditions determine the nature and method of the education process at all educational levels. The diversity of these conditions and their reflection in educational practice is the subject of our investigation. EMOTION IN TEACHING A FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Summary: Much previous research in Foreign Language Teaching has focused mainly on the influence of negative emotions (anxiety about the foreign language), while the influence of positive emotions has only rarely been analysed. A more detailed investigation of the role of positive emotions in foreign language didactics can be based on the development of positive psychological techniques focused on the individual's strengths with the objective of boosting positive professional and personal experiences. The research finding that so-called emotionally symptomatic stimuli remain in the memory for a long time and are recalled more precisely and readily than neutral memories has proven to be a crucially important factor in the teaching of a foreign language.

PREVENTIVE AND FOLLOW-UP CARE

Summary: This research topic broadly reflects the issue of preventive follow-up care. Through early intervention, preventive care is focused on averting a health disorder before it begins, or on alleviating the consequences of a disorder after it is acquired. The purpose of follow-up care is to actively monitor in the long-term the health of a patient who is at risk of or suffering from a disease or in a state of deteriorating health. The emphasis is on patients for which a positive change in health in accordance with the progress of the disease can be justifiably anticipated in cases in which an early finding can influence further treatment and positively affect the development of the disease in a fundamental way. Our intention is to investigate this issue in the context of interdisciplinary and interdepartmental co-operation.
